Status of Kilns in ACPS ~ December 2011

This is what is needed to outfit all our schools with working kilns as well as conduct a baseline safety review. We have some schools that have kilns in rooms/locations that aren't safe.

We would like to purchase the SKUTT 240v KM1027 1 phase kiln. We estimate the cost to be \$3000 for the kiln and furniture (stacking shelves to rest clay on). Schools that don't currently have a kiln need to able to upgrade an area for the electrical requirements place it in a closed room with a vent to the outdoors. Building services is able to install the kilns.

Perhaps if we purchase four kilns we could negotiate a bulk discount?
