Code of Virginia 22.1-178

- Physical Examination
- □ Good Driving Record
- Character Statements
- Commercial Driver's License with endorsements
- □ 18 Years of Age
- Drug and Alcohol Testing
- Other state requirements per 8VAC20-70-280: Adequate driving experience, TB certificate, minimum of 48 hours training.



Drivers have to be Responsible to their safety team.

Responsible = reliable, dependable, answerable and accountable.





Responsibility to the School System

- Turn in reports on time.
- Work closely with the school principal, know school policies.
- Follow school policies, regulations and laws.
- Exercise the proper representation of facts.
- Exercise truth and accuracy.
- Maintain good moral standings.
- Exercise proper conduct.
- Exercise appropriate use of assigned resources.

- Accept responsibility
- Accept authority
- Exhibit professionalism
- Work to the best of ability
- Willing to learn
- Communicate



Responsibility to Fellow Employees

- Assist other drivers
- Be courteous at all times
- Compliment good work
- Professional courtesy and communications

- Promote good working relationships
- Seek help from school officials to solve problems involving you and other drivers



Responsibility to Students

- Follow the designated schedule
- Use safe driving techniques
- Maintain a clean bus
- Maintain high standards for personal habits

- Use consistency in discipline
- Communicate in a professional manner
- Follow local school procedures
- Impose fair treatment



How to Promote a Positive Environment

- Follow the designated schedule
- Exercise safe practices
- Keep a clean bus
- Maintain high personal standards
- Speak courteously
- Use reasonable and fair discipline
- Develop rapport with students
- Acknowledge good behavior
- Set good examples



Responsibility to Parents

- Discussions with parents should be conducted in a calm and professional manner.
- Impress upon parents the bus stop times.
- □ Be on time, be courteous and be cooperative.
- Exhibit concern for safety, practicing good and proper driving habits.
- Be receptive to parents' and students' suggestions.
- Advise parents that the safety of the busload is paramount.
- Explain to the parents the school board's policy.
- Seek assistance from school officials to help solve problems.

The School Bus is purposely the most visible aspect of our public educational system. You are highly visible. The image people have of you influences their opinion of the school system itself.



Responsibility to Yourself

- Get adequate rest
- Have an adequate diet
- Monitor any health issues
- □ Follow all safe practices
- Follow all policies
- Plan ahead when making other commitments
- Wear appropriate attire for task and working conditions

You have a safety sensitive job. Your decisions and conditions can and will affect others.

- The number of motorists and others in the environment

Give thought of the general public's acts:

- Expects proficient driving
- May not always recognize or cite good performance
- Will take note of poor actions
